## Wheelchair Accessible Rides Coming Soon!

Interfaith Caregivers of Ozaukee County has been serving seniors and adults with disabilities for over 23 years. Transportation services are provided throughout Ozaukee County, as well as Milwaukee, Waukesha, Washington, and Sheboygan Counties to address barriers to access. When public transportation is unavailable or inaccessible, Interfaith Ozaukee helps removes those barriers. Transportation to medical appointments, pharmacies, grocery stores, food pantries, and exercise services are provided at no charge by Interfaith Ozaukee volunteers utilizing their own personal vehicles—until now!

Interfaith Ozaukee is extremely proud to announce the acquisition of the first-ever wheelchair accessible vehicle. As we continue to build our fleet, these vehicles will significantly impact how Interfaith Ozaukee fulfills the mission of keeping seniors independent in their homes.

### Solving the Senior Transportation Problem with Your Help

The Interfaith agencies of Ozaukee, Washington, Waukesha and Milwaukee has the state's largest combined population of senior citizens, age 65 years and older. Many have limited access to transportation and services due to fixed incomes, lack of community-wide transportation systems, and insufficient family and neighborly supports. An unfortunate result is that many of those seniors struggle to manage their healthcare and nutrition needs. As this region's population of seniors grows in numbers and seniors are living well into their 90's, the need for efficient and affordable services will continue to grow. These four Interfaith agencies have partnered and committed to a joint approach to increasing volunteer recruitment in an effort to address the current rise in services requested. The projected growing numbers of seniors through a multi-county initiative called **Drive.Give.Serve** will aid in developing a consistent message for volunteer recruitment and best support our seniors.

## **Dementia Training**

All Interfaith Ozaukee volunteers were invited to attend newly developed Dementia Volunteer Training sessions. This continuing education program serves as refresher training and a critical volunteer retention program.

Sessions included professional explanations of various forms of dementia, role playing exercises, and supportive materials and video scenarios.

Common signs are declines in learning and memory, changes in judgement, reasoning, language, attention, mood shifts, and visual-spatial skills.

Training helps volunteers to recognize and better manage these symptoms.
